Un astfel de pol nu are o localizare impusă, astfel încât din punct de vedere teritorial un pol de competitivitate poate fi plasat într-o singură locație zonală, cât și în zone ce aparțin mai multor regiuni de dezvoltare din România.	a) Societate comercială constituită din minim doi membri ai polului de competitivitate; b) Asociație legal constituită din minim doi membri ai polului de competitivitate; c) Parteneriat format din cel puțin doi membri privați ai polului care au încheiat un acord de parteneriat pentru realizarea proiectului pentru care se solicită finanțare; d) Polul de competitivitate, atunci când acesta este constituit ca persoană juridică, indiferent de forma juridică de organizare. For this purpose, grant funding will be offered to one project managed by a partnership made up of not-for-profit research bodies, public institutions and civil society organisations.
