This mutual learning could in particular target the key growth areas for employment: the low-carbon, resource-efficient economy ("green economy"), the digital economy (ICT sector) and the health and social care sector ("white jobs").</p>	<p>To be eligible applicants and partners must fall within one of the following categories:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Public authorities or semi-state agencies at national or regional level and international organisations. ▪ Non-profit private or public organisations active mainly in the area of employment policy, management of transitions on the labour market and labour market research including the analysis of skills/competences development. These organisations are encouraged to establish partnerships with other stakeholders including with public authorities, semi-state agencies and/or social partners. ▪ Social partner organisations. In application of Article 114 of the Financial Regulation, social partner organisations without legal personality are also eligible provided that their representatives have the capacity to undertake legal obligations on their behalf and assume financial liability. ▪ European social partner organisations currently consulted in accordance with Article 154 TFEU (ex Art. 138 TEC). ▪ National or regional social partners organisations, as long as the project is part of a European approach. ▪ Research centres and institutes, universities, education and vocational training institutions or networks and civil society organisations. 	<p>Three areas have been defined for this call:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Mutual learning in the field of skills and employment 2. EU Sector Skills Councils 3. Restructuring <p>Mutual learning in the field of skills and employment. The objective of this area is to encourage exchanges and mutual learning at all levels and to enhance the transferability of the most effective policies, good practices and innovative approaches to implement the skills dimension of the flagship initiative "An Agenda for New Skills and Jobs – Equipping people with the right skills for employment" and the Employment Package Communication "Towards a job-rich recovery". This mutual learning could in particular target the key growth areas for employment: the low-carbon, resource-efficient economy ("green economy"), the digital economy (ICT sector) and the health and social care sector ("white jobs").</p> <p>EU Sector Skills Councils The Commission supports the creation of EU Sector Councils on Employment and Skills ("EU sector skills council" in short) when there is a demand for their creation from stakeholders in particular from the European social partners. This can enable stakeholders to be in possession of more and better information on the evolution of their sector in terms of skills and employment than if they relied only on their national sources. It can also facilitate peer-learning amongst national observatories by creating a platform of exchange between labour market representatives and their counter side representing education and training providers.</p> <p>Restructuring The overall objective of this area is to support the development and dissemination of better expertise and capabilities among the actors concerned in the areas of anticipation, preparation and the accompanying of socially responsible restructuring processes as highlighted in the Commission communication on Restructuring and employment –anticipating and accompanying restructuring in order to develop employment: the role of the European Union (COM (2005) 120 final) and subsequent policy documents, notably the Green Paper on "Restructuring and anticipation of change: what lessons from recent experience?" (COM (2012) 7 final). Priorities may also target the improvement of the capabilities of the actors on good and/or innovative practices of anticipating change and restructuring at European, sectoral, regional and company level; on the evolution of economic sectors; on the evolution of the roles, responsibilities and practices of the economic and social actors, through exchanges, reports, studies and other analysis and dissemination tools.</p>	<p>The foreseen budgetary allocation to this call is EUR 3 600 000.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ For areas 1 and 3 the indicative amount foreseen, depending on the quality of the proposals submitted, is EUR 1 000 000. ▪ For area 2 the indicative amount foreseen, depending on the quality of the proposals submitted, is EUR 2 600 000 	<p>Under this call for proposals, the European Commission may finance up to 80% of the total eligible cost of the action. Contributions in kind (i.e. contributions for which no financial flow can be traced in the written accounts like unpaid charity work by a private individual or corporate body, etc.) will not be taken into account. 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<p>European Comission</p> <p>Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion DG</p>	<p>Budget Heading 04.04.17</p> <p>Preparatory action "Youth Guarantee"</p> <p>Supporting partnerships for activation measures targeting young people through projects in the context of Youth Guarantee schemes at national, regional or local level</p> <p>Call for proposals No. VP/2012/012</p>	<p>The present call for proposals is aiming at selecting and financing partnerships supporting the testing of:</p> <p>a) Cooperation between relevant actors/stakeholders to carry out activation measures targeting young people thereby piloting new Youth Guarantee schemes. Relevant stakeholders would be supported nationally, regionally or locally in providing counselling and help regarding the implementation of a Youth Guarantee scheme.</p> <p>b) Programmes at national, regional or local level for young people at risk of leaving education too early: to develop their skills and, in this context, put a special focus on the networking between all relevant stakeholders (such as companies, schools/vocational training centres, youth welfare services, employment services, etc.) as an important measure to improve the integration of young people into the labour market.</p> <p>c) In regions and local areas, where youth unemployment rates are above the EU average and/or well above the national average, innovative approaches that apply to young people facing multiple barriers (such as social exclusion, poverty or discrimination) to labour market entry, in particular those living in rural, deprived urban, remote and peripheral areas.</p> <p>Given the short duration envisaged for implementing the action, the rather limited budget per action, and in order to facilitate its replication/transferability while allowing proper evaluation, project proposals should focus on one of these a) b) c) axes only.</p>	<p>To be eligible, applicant organisations/institutions can be either:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> national, regional or local authorities, or social partners, or public employment services. <p>To be eligible for funding under this call, project proposals must be implemented in cooperation with other relevant actors/stakeholders (such as national, regional or local authorities, ESF managing authorities, public, private or third sector employment services, education and training institutions, universities, social partners, chambers of commerce, associations of employers, youth welfare and social services, youth clubs and associations, and any other relevant community actors).</p> <p>Each proposal should ensure the participation of at least four of the following types of organisations/institutions: public authorities, employment services, education sector, employment sector, youth sector, social partners, social and community services or NGOs.</p>	<p>The established partnerships are expected among others to:</p> <p>i. Identify the group(s) of young people they want to target and justify their choice(s);</p> <p>ii. Identify the needs of the targeted young people versus one of the above options a), b) and c);</p> <p>iii. Design the measures and processes that would be needed to establish youth guarantee scheme(s) corresponding to these needs, that should cover in particular a job offer either locally or in another region or Member State, a traineeship, an apprenticeship or any other activation measure allowing a first work experience and provide young people with holistic personalised guidance and individual action planning;</p> <p>iv. Assess the capacity and assign the role of each member organisation/institution of the partnership in order to deliver the chosen scheme(s);</p> <p>v. Organise inter alia all necessary meetings, training sessions, awareness raising activities that will allow developing the capacity building of the respective actors;</p> <p>vi. Test the chosen scheme(s) with a group of the targeted young people;</p> <p>vii. Evaluate the results (success and failure factors) of the tested scheme(s).</p> <p>Type of activities</p> <p>In order to deliver the tasks deemed necessary to implement the Youth Guarantee schemes as described under the above point 5, the following type of activities will be eligible for EU funding:</p> <p>a) Design of a youth guarantee scheme, constitution and coordination of the partnership to deliver the chosen scheme;</p> <p>b) Management of the project, including all activities needed by the partnership and its members to deliver the chosen approach (e.g. external expertise; workshops, seminars, training sessions and any other kind of meetings; where necessary, travel and accommodation);</p> <p>c) Any activity needed to support and manage the test phase with young people, including individualised services, travel and accommodation costs for the group of young people;</p> <p>d) In-built evaluation of the project's results and outcome, including the tested youth guarantee scheme and the corresponding partnership.</p>	<p>Min 100.000 eur</p> <p>Max 250.000 eur</p>	<p>5%</p>	<p>22 October 2012</p>	<p>http://ec.europa.eu/social/main.jsp?catId=630&langId=en&callId=362&furtherCalls=yes</p>
