This call will therefore be used to finance consultations, meetings, negotiations and other actions designed to achieve these objectives and to promote actions outlined in the European Commission's Communication on <i>The European social dialogue, a force for innovation and change</i> (COM(2002) 341), the Communication on <i>Partnership for change in an enlarged Europe – Enhancing the contribution of European social dialogue</i> (COM(2004) 557) and the Commission Staff Working Document on the <i>Functioning and potential of European sectoral social dialogue</i> (SEC(2010) 964).	<ul For this purpose, grant funding will be offered to one project managed by a partnership made up of not-for-profit research bodies, public institutions and civil society organisations. Restructuring</li> </ol> <p><b>Mutual learning in the field of skills and employment.</b></p> <p>The objective of this area is to encourage exchanges and mutual learning at all levels and to enhance the transferability of the most effective policies, good practices and innovative approaches to implement the skills dimension of the flagship initiative "An Agenda for New Skills and Jobs – Equipping people with the right skills for employment" and the Employment Package Communication "Towards a job-rich recovery". This mutual learning could in particular target the key growth areas for employment: the low-carbon, resource-efficient economy ("green economy"), the digital economy (ICT sector) and the health and social care sector ("white jobs").</p> <p><b>EU Sector Skills Councils</b></p> <p>The Commission supports the creation of EU Sector Councils on Employment and Skills ("EU sector skills council" in short) when there is a demand for their creation from stakeholders in particular from the European social partners. This can enable stakeholders to be in possession of more and better information on the evolution of their sector in terms of skills and employment than if they relied only on their national sources. 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European Comission	HERCULE II Training in the area of the fight against fraud Grant Programme 2012	<p>The Hercule II Programme is an EU action programme designed to promote activities for protecting the EU's financial interests in the field of revenues and expenditure for the period 2007-2013. The basic legal act is Decision No 878/2007/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 July 2007.</p> <p>The Call for Proposals 2012 is an expression of OLAF's willingness to support training activities contributing in a preventative and/or operational way to combating fraud and corruption which is or may be detrimental to the financial interests of the European Union, namely the EU's revenue, expenditure and assets.</p> <p>This Call for Proposals relates to line 24.02.01 of the General Budget of the European Union for 2012, subject to availability of appropriations. The measures supported by OLAF through the award of grants are intended to contribute to fighting fraud and corruption detrimental to the European Union's financial interests, including the fight against cigarette smuggling and counterfeiting.
