



Priority 1 - e-Justice

Priority given to projects aiming at joining or enhancing existing or on-going e-Justice projects: Projects facilitating electronic cross-border interaction and communication between judicial authorities, as well as with citizens, businesses and practitioners in judicial proceedings

Priority given to the development of concrete cases on the use of artificial intelligence and distributed ledger technology in the justice area

Activities that can be funded:

 analytical, conceptual, design and elaboration work, IT software development, quality assurance and related auxiliary measures necessary for the establishment of new IT systems, as well as the expansion and adaptation of existing national and transnational solutions towards addressing the objectives of the call.
